Course Title: HSE Emergency First Aid at Work	
Who is it for?	This course is aimed at low risk employers and employees to meet their legal obligation for First Aid Provision in the workplace. The course could also be used by a high risk employer that would like their qualified First Aiders to be assisted by these qualified in the Emergency First Aid at Work.

Whilst there is no written paper or practical exam, passing of the course is dependent on candidate's participation levels.</p>
Course Duration:	6 Hours The course consists of 6 hours contact teaching time. Normally the course is run over a day. Typically the course will run from 9:30am-4:30pm to include a half hour lunch and two 15 minute coffee breaks in the morning and afternoon

Additional Notes:	This qualification came into force from 1 st October 2009. The purpose of the course is to replace the 'Appointed Persons' First Aid Course to achieve a more regulated and controlled qualification. Ultimately a higher standard of First Aid course
